Definitions and Explanations:**Rural and Urban:**

The "urban" population in the 1956 Census included all persons residing in cities, towns and villages of 1,000 population and over, whether incorporated or unincorporated as well as the population of all parts of census metropolitan areas and other major urban areas; the remainder was classified as "rural".

In 1961 and 1966 all cities, towns and villages of 1,000 or over, whether incorporated or not, were classed as "urban", as well as urbanized fringes of (a) cities classed as metropolitan or other major urban areas, and (b) certain smaller cities where the population of the city (or town) together with its urbanized fringe amounted to 10,000 or more. The remainder of the population was classed as "rural".

Rural Farm and Rural Non-Farm:

Population, households and families are classified as "farm" or "non-farm" depending upon whether or not they were residents of a dwelling situated within the boundaries of a farm located in a rural area. A farm for 1951 and 1956 was defined as a holding of : (1) three acres or more in size, or (2) from one to three acres with agricultural production in 1950 and 1955 valued at \$250 or more. This differs from 1961 and 1966 when a farm was defined as a holding of one or more acres with sales of agricultural products of \$50 or more. All persons living on such holdings in rural areas are classed as "rural farm" regardless of their occupation. These figures do not include the farm operators and their families who operated farms but resided in neighbouring towns and villages at the census date. Such persons were not considered to be living on farms and their dwellings were classified as "urban" or "rural non-farm" rather than "rural farm" dwellings. Also, farm totals do not include persons living on farms in urban areas.

Definitions and Explanations:**Household:**

For census purposes, a household consists of a person or group of persons occupying one dwelling. It usually consists of a family group, with or without lodgers, employees, etc. However, it may consist of a group of unrelated persons, of two or more families sharing a dwelling, or of one person living alone. Every person is a member of some household, and the number of households equals the number of occupied dwellings. A dwelling is a structurally separate set of living quarters with a private entrance from outside or a common hall or stairway inside. Entrance must not be through anyone else's living quarters.

Type of household:

Households are classified as to whether they consist of one family, two or more families, or are non-family households, and whether additional persons such as relatives or lodgers are present.

In a one-family household, the family is usually that of the household head, but it may be one living as a related, lodging or other type of family with a household head who is a non-family person.

Similarly in two or more family households, one family may be that of the household head, or the household head may be a non-family person with whom two or more families are residing.

Non-family households are constituted either of one person living alone, or of a group of two or more persons not in families but living together as a household.

Average number of persons per household is based on private households since collective households are excluded from the data in this review.

Definitions and Explanations:**Family:**

A census family consists of a husband and wife (with or without children who have never married), or a parent with one or more children never married, living together in the same dwelling. Adopted children and stepchildren are counted as own children, and in fact, a family, for census purposes, may comprise a man or woman living with a guardianship child or ward under 21 years of age. It should be noted that the term "children" refers to children in families who have never married, who are under 25 years of age, living at home at the census date.

Once a child is married, he or she ceases to be considered a part of the parents' family, for census purposes, even though living in the same household. Such married children when living with husband or wife and/or children constitute a second family unit within the same household.

Some of these settlements experienced boundary changes which in some cases have had an effect on the comparability of the figures from one census to another.

NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR

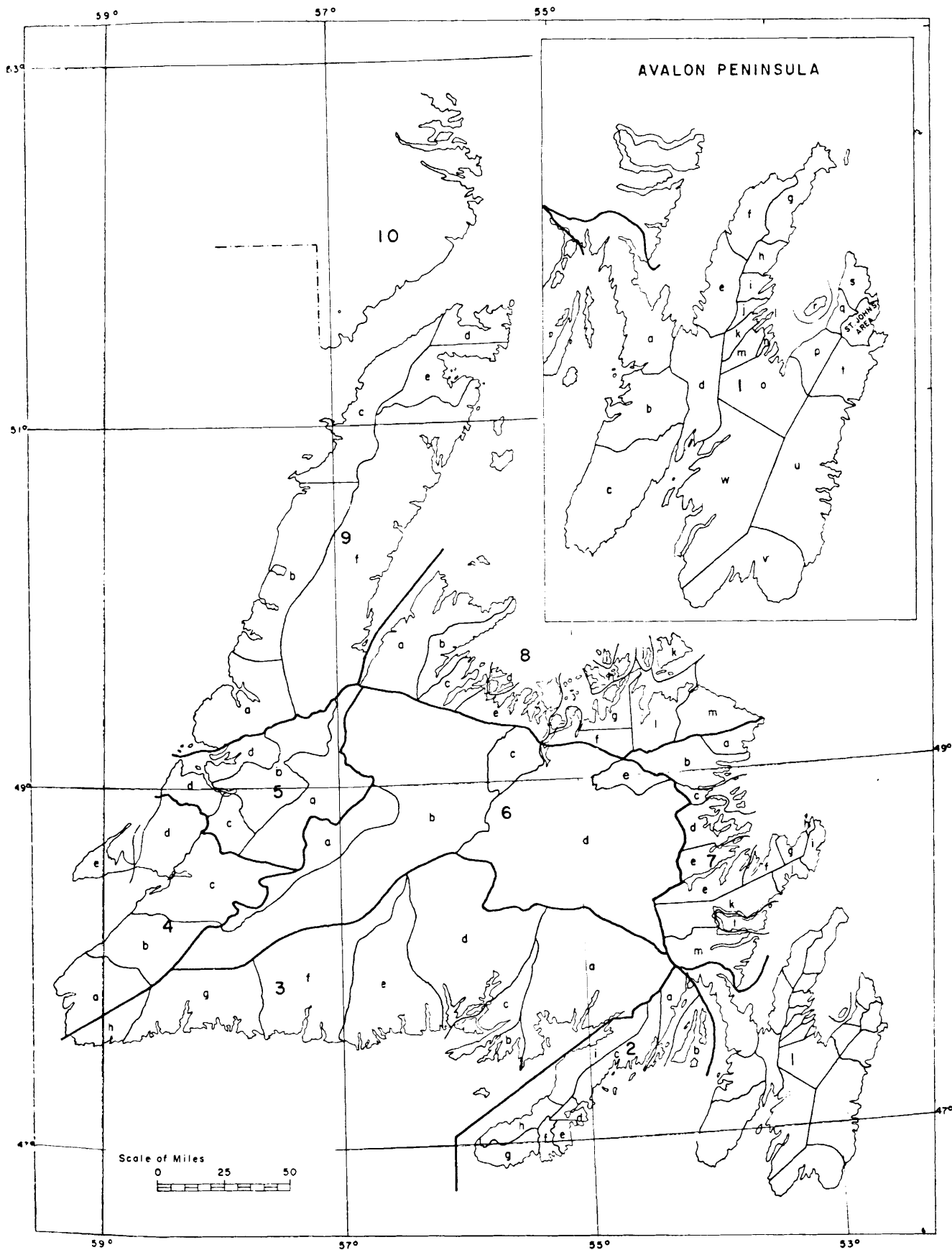
