Notes:

1. Refers to the basic division of private households into family and non-family households. Family households refers to a household that contains at least one census family, that is, a married couple with or without children, or a couple living in common-law with or without children, or a lone parent living with one or more children.
2. Refers to a single census family, with or without additional persons in the household.
3. Refers to couple households with at least one child aged 24 and under.
4. Refers to couple households without children aged 24 and under. Includes couple households with all children aged 25 and over.
5. Refers to all lone-parent family households regardless of age of children.
6. Refers to a household in which two or more census families (with or without additional persons) occupy the same private dwelling.
7. Refers to two or more people who share a private household, but who do not constitute a census family.
